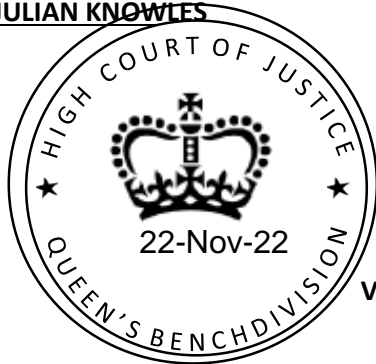

ORDER

UPON HEARING THE DEFENDANT IN PERSON

IT IS ORDERED THAT

- 1. The eviction currently listed for 23 November 2022 is STAYED until 10am on Monday 28 November 2022.**

REASONS

- 1. This matter has come before me in the interim applications court at short notice at around 4pm on Tuesday 22 November 2022.**
- 2. This matter is confused. The Defendant appears to be the subject of an order for possession from Romford County Court which threatens him with eviction on the morning of 23 November 2022. He tells me it is his house. The Claimant is his son.**

- 3. The Defendant is of advanced years and is complaining of chest pains. I have been faced with different submissions going off at different tangents, and there appears to be some background and history to this matter.**

- 4. All things considered, pursuant to s 37 of the Senior Courts Act 1981, I consider the appropriate course is for the eviction to be stayed for a short period so that the Defendant can go to Romford County Court in order to seek to have the possession order set aside, and/or to take legal advice. Given the risk of irremediable harm, this seems to me to be what the balance of convenience favours.**

- 5. One of the documents asks for a transfer to the Central Criminal Court. I do not understand what is being referred to, and I have no such power.**
